

PLACES TO VISIT NEAR KIET GROUP OF INSTITUTIONS

1. **Drizzling Land Water & Amusement Park:** (Distance from KIET-9 km) Drizzling Land Water & Amusement Park is a water themed park with magnificent pools, exciting fountains and thrilling rides and slides. They have the region's biggest roller coaster ride that makes the park a favourite amongst adventure buffs. It provides all the necessary facilities to ensure the guests have a memorable time and is a perfect attraction for weekend outings, especially during the summers.



2. **ISKCON Temple, Ghaziabad:** (Distance from KIET- 11 km) Krishna temple, managed by the Isckon society, is beautifully made and extremely peaceful to the eyes and the mind. You should not miss the morning and evening Aarti during which the place is transformed into a music and dance festival on the tunes of 'Hare Rama hare Krishna'.



3. **City Forest Ghaziabad:** (Distance from KIET-15 km) City Forest is a splendid park that expands over 175 acres of land and has been built over an existing cover of trees by planting more trees and maintaining the region. The park has lakes, a deer park, a bamboo park, walking and hiking trails, facility for horse riding, boating and guided Gypsy Tours. The beautiful landscape and the enchanting vibe of the park make it a famous picnic spot in the region.



4. **Swaminarayan Akshardham Temple, Delhi: (Distance from KIET-36 km)** An epitome of Indian culture, spirituality, and architecture, Swaminarayan Akshardham Temple is an abode of God built in 2005. Sitting deftly near the banks of River Yamuna, the temple showcases Hinduism and its age old culture. Dedicated to Lord Swaminarayan, the temple is undoubtedly a work of miracle. Akshardham has made its way to the Guinness Book of World Records as the World's Largest Comprehensive Hindu Temple.



5. **India Gate: (Distance from KIET-39 km)** The All India War Memorial, popularly known as the India Gate, is a war memorial located in New Delhi. It is dedicated to the 82,000 soldiers, both Indian and British, who died during the First World War and the Third Anglo-Afghan War. The Amar JawanJyoti is the burning structure, right underneath the archway, which symbolizes the eternal, immortal soldiers of India.



6. **National War Memorial: (Distance from KIET-39 km)** National War Memorial is a monument constructed by the Government of India in the vicinity of the India Gate, New Delhi, to honour its Armed Forces. The memorial is spread over 40 acres and is made around the existing chhatri (canopy) near India Gate. The memorial wall is flushed with the ground and in harmony with existing aesthetics. Names of martyrs during 1947–48, 1961 (Goa), 1962 (China), 1965, 1971, 1987 (Siachen), 1987-88 (Sri Lanka), 1999 (Kargil), and other operations such as Operation Rakshak, are inscribed on the memorial walls.



7. **Red Fort: (Distance from KIET 41 km)** The Red Fort was the official seat of Mughal rule and authority from 1648 onwards, when the 5th Mughal emperor, Shah Jahan, decided to move the capital of the empire from Agra to Delhi. Constructed using red sandstone, it remains one of the architectural marvels of the Mughal era. In 2007, it became a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



8. **Bangla Sahib Gurudwara: (Distance from KIET-42 km)** Gurudwara Bangla Sahib is one of the most prominent Sikh gurdwara, or Sikh house of worship, in Delhi, India and known for its association with the eighth Sikh Guru, Guru Har Krishan, as well as the pool inside its complex, known as the "Sarovar." It was first built as a small shrine by Sikh General Sardar Bhagel Singh Dhaliwal in 1783, who supervised the construction of nine Sikh shrines in Delhi in the same year, during the reign of Mughal Emperor, Shah Alam II. It is situated near Connaught Place, New Delhi on Baba Khark Singh Marg and it is instantly recognisable by its golden dome and tall flagpole, Nishan Sahib. Located next to it is the Sacred Heart Cathedral
